RULING

1. The applicant with another not before this court was charged and convicted on two counts of robbery with violence contrary to section 296 (2) of the Penal Code, Cap 63 Laws of Kenya. He was sentenced to death on both counts. He filed his first appeal where his sentence was reduced to 20 years imprisonment
2. He has now filed the present application dated 16th July 2025 seeking sentence review. The grounds raised are that the trial court failed to take into consideration the time spent in custody.
3. I have considered the application, the grounds in support and the applicable law. From the record of the court, the court considered the applicant's mitigation, and the fact that the applicant was a first offender before sentencing. Having considered the application in its totality. The sentence imposed was also legal in the circumstances of the case.
4. In my view I find no good cause or reason to revise the sentence imposed. The application dismissed.
5. The applicant is barred from filing any other application without leave of court.
