**RULING**

1. The applicant was charged and after a full trial convicted for two counts of offences: vandalism of energy installation and infrastructure contrary to section 169(1)(b) of the *Energy Act* and escape from lawful custody contrary to section 123 as read with section 36 of the Penal Code. He was sentence to pay a fine of Kshs.100,000 in default to serve 1 year imprisonment and Kshs. 50,000 in default to serve 6 months imprisonment respectively.
2. He has filed the present application undated application seeking revision of sentence. The grounds raised are that the court failed to consider the time spent in remand custody.
3. I have considered the application, the grounds in support and the applicable law. From the record of the trial court, the court considered the applicant's mitigation, the time spent in remand custody and the fact that the applicant was a first offender before sentencing. Having considered the application in its totality. The sentence imposed was also legal in the circumstances of the case.
4. In my view I find no good cause or reason to revise the sentence imposed by the trial court. The application dismissed.
