RULING

1. I have considered the summons for review dated 9th June, 2026 which is hinged on want of service.
2. The 2nd administrator contends that she ought to have been personally served to respond thereto.
3. That the application was served on the advocates on record and that the firm of **Obura Mbeche** had ceased from acting for her.
4. This Court has not been duly notified of **Obura Mbeche** ceasing from acting from the administrator.
5. I am unpersuaded of any basis to exercise my discretion.
6. I note that the 2nd administrator cites an appeal pending before the Court of Appeal.

7. The Appellant may consider seeking a stay order from the Court of Appeal.
8. I find no judgment made ex-parte warranting review.
9. I accordingly dismiss the application with costs to the Respondent.
